








Project characteristics

- Duration 4 years








Developmental objective (s)



Major accomplishment and events during the period Sept.2011 – Dec. 2015

- 450 "Vets" hired

- Inspections increased 10 fold, no compliances reported
- 7 Regional offices completed including infrastructure

- New curriculum for vet. educ.
- Chief veterinary officer in place
- Internal homepage SVD document
- Institutional reform plan
- Animal helalth action plan
